

## Pink Dolphins

Pink dolphins are one of the most uniquely structured marine animals with fascinating feeding habits and specific habitats. A pink dolphin is 2.5 to 3 meters long. It weighs 90 kilograms. Males are generally larger and weigh more. Their vertebrae (the bony sections making up your backbone) are very flexible. Its vertebrae were constructed to maneuver in and out branches in the water and to swim in shallow waters. Pink dolphins are actually pink in color.

These wonderful marine animals can be found in tributaries and main rivers like the Orinoco and Amazon Rivers. They usually gather where rivers meet. Pink dolphins are mostly in South America. You can also find them in swampy waters.

They eat crustaceans, catfish, and small fresh water fish. They locate their food by using echolocation, sending high pitched sound waves around the water. When these sound waves find the fish, they swim to the dolphin. Then, the dolphin senses them coming, through his long jawbone- the jawbone acts like an antenna. Later, the dolphin swims to the fish and eats them. Pink dolphins like very bony fish. Their teeth are so strong that they can crack the toughest catfish! After they puncture the animal, they just swallow it. Later, it vomits what it can't digest. The pink dolphin is a fascinating animal that is interesting to learn about!!
